

# Santorini style



THE village of Oia on the northern tip of Santorini already has stylish, whitewashed boutique hotels and villas but what the hell, here's another. A new 18-room all-suite clifftop hotel, **Mystique**, has just opened. Formerly the Oia Village Hotel, it has had new life breathed into it by Starwood's Luxury Collection.

The rooms are carved into c'iffs and have private terraces with teak day beds and views across the Aegean Caldera, a sea-filled crater formed by the collapse of a volcano long ago. The style is traditional Greek island with whitewashed interiors and limestone floors, driftwood lamps and bedheads mixed with whirlpool tubs and flat-screen televisions. There's an infinity pool, terrace bar, 150-year-old wine cellar with rare and local wines and a restaurant serving regional food such as freshly caught lobster.

If the romance of the setting — Oia is known for its stunning sunsets — overtakes you, then there is a chapel on-site. Suites from €420 a night including champagne breakfast and airport transfers. [www.luxurycollection.com](http://www.luxurycollection.com)
